ABOUT THIS BOOK: *Night* is a first-person narrative of Elie Wiesel's experience as a 16-year-old boy who, along with his family, is rounded up from his home in northern Transylvania, placed in a cramped ghetto, and ultimately sent to Auschwitz concentration camp. Elie recounts his terrifying story through the lens of a devout boy who is suddenly faced with deep despair, lost innocence, lost faith, and having to endure the evils of Hitler's Final Solution. Raw and unforgettable, Wiesel presents his experience as a testament to why such events must never be repeated.
